Writing opportunities will include:

- Writing character descriptions
- Exploring new vocabulary
- Sequencing and retelling traditional tales
- Inventing own characters and settings
- Changing the ending of traditional stories
- Learning about the suffix -ed

Phonics:

Children will take part in daily phonics sessions at their current reading level to develop their fluency and decoding. Children will continue to learn set 2 and 3 RWI sounds.

Spellings:

These will be based on the children's RWI story book each week and will be given once they reach red level and above.
