


Act of Succession

The Succession to the Crown Act 2013 is an Act of the Parliament of the United Kingdom that altered the laws of succession to the British throne. Prior to this amendment, male heirs took precedent over their female siblings, regardless of age. The amendment means that succession is now gender neutral and the crown will now descend to heirs in order of birth only. The Act applies to those born after 28 October 2011.
