Key Facts

Van Gogh is one of the most famous figures in Western Art, but this happened only after his death. Most of his 1,100 drawings and nearly 900 oil paintings were produced in the last two years of his life.

Much of his work is characterised by complementary colours and bold brush strokes.

Van Gogh was a postimpressionist artist. He suffered from mental illness, also neglecting his physical health.
