



Maths

This half term, children will be taught to:

Interpret and construct simple pictograms, tally charts, block diagrams and simple tables. Ask and answer simple questions by counting the number of objects in each category and sorting the categories by quantity. Ask and answer questions about totalling and comparing categorical data.

Recognise, find, name and write $\frac{1}{3}$, $\frac{1}{4}$, $\frac{2}{4}$ and $\frac{3}{4}$ of a length, shape, set of objects or quantity. write simple fractions for example, $\frac{1}{2}$ of 6 = 3 and recognise the equivalence of $\frac{2}{4}$ and $\frac{1}{2}$.

Science – Minibeasts

This half-term, children will learn about the importance of biodiversity and what an ecosystem is. The planned unit of learning focuses on minibeasts and habitats found in the UK. The class will learn about different types of minibeasts, their microhabitats, what they need from their habitat and how living things depend on each other in order to survive. They will also learn about the benefits of minibeasts for the planet and the important roles they play, including pollination. Part of the aim of this unit is to eliminate fear and misconceptions surrounding minibeasts in order to build a better understanding and appreciation of their importance for the planet and how they impact daily life. This unit is linked to the Living Things and their Habitats strand of the National Curriculum for science.
