
Key Question

For Christians, what kind of king was Jesus?

Topic Overview

- To explore the idea that Christians believe Jesus came to Earth to get people into heaven but also to make the world more like heaven.
- Look at some 'kingdom parables' to find out what the 'kingdom of God' is meant to be like.
- Read Luke 14: 12-24 (The Feast).
- Read Matthew 21: 33-46 (The Tenants in the Vineyard).
- To explore ideas about what would make the world a better place and compare with what Jesus believed would make the world a better place (similar to Heaven).
- To address the key question of 'What kind of king is Jesus?'.
- To find out how local organisations or churches help those in need.
