

Ringway Primary School P.E. and Sport Premium 2022-2023

Ringway Primary School received **£17,555** in P.E. and Sport Premium funding for the 2022/23 academic year. Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of physical education, physical activity and support provided. Schools must use the premium to secure improvements in the following 5 key indicators:

1. Engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity.
2. Profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement.
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
5. Increased participation in competitive sport.

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The allocated funding for Ringway Primary school has been spent, with the above key indicators in mind, on the following.

Staff in KS1 and LKS2 will work closely with NUF staff to gain further insight and confidence when planning and delivering Commando Joes session with the view that RPS staff will team teach session with NUF staff towards the end of each unit. NUF staff to work with Nursery staff as a form of effective CPD in traditional PE lessons as, due to timetabling clashes, this was not possible in the last academic year. In addition to this, All Star Dance will also provide two half-terms' worth of specialist dance lessons for both KS1 and UKS2 (with LKS2 staff members having experience in teaching dance and high levels of confidence and knowledge in delivering effective session. NUF will also provide one after-school club per-week with the rationale of using NUF's credence in the community to further raise the profile of PE and engagement of chn in competitive sport.</p>	<p>RPS staff have gained further experience working with NUF staff to develop confidence and knowledge in delivering effective, high-quality PE lessons (including dance and Commando Joes lessons).</p> <p>NUF after-school clubs had high levels of attendance and often required additional RPS staff to be present to help supervise and maintain appropriate adult to child ratios.</p>

Enables class teacher to deliver CoJo sessions once per-week, in addition to traditional P.E. lessons, with a more cross-curricular approach focused on inspirational individuals and promoting the RESPECT characteristics while remaining physically active.</p>	<p>Each class has a weekly Commando Joes lesson in which children have developed core skills in line with the PE curriculum as a well as developing aspects tied to the school's RESPECT core values.</p>

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£2,505.60 at £69.60 x 36 (weeks)	Swimming Lessons at BSC	1, 2 and 4	For specialist swimming tuition to be provided by Blyth Sports Centre to Year 4 (Autumn), Year 5 (Spring) and Year 6 (Summer) pupils with the view to achieving at least minimum NC requirements in swimming.	Three classes, rotating termly, have continued to have specialist swimming lessons delivered by BSC staff and supported by RPS staff. All children have made clear progress in relation to curriculum expectations from their starting points.
£1,440	All Star Dance after-school dance club provision 1 hour session x36 weeks	1, 2 and 4	To enable provision of an after-school dance club provided for two half-terms each year to pupils in Year 1-6. We have elected to work with All Star Productions throughout the academic year as their staff are familiar to children throughout school, due to ASD staff providing specialist tuition throughout our partnership with the Newcastle United Foundation, and such positive relationships both raise the engagement of PE throughout school and boost the engagement in a wider range of physical activities.	Enabled the provision of a highly-popular after-school club offered to a wide range of pupils throughout the academic year. Children throughout school were already familiar with ASD staff from previous dance lesson units so this ensured that they were familiar with staff and more willing to participate.
£2,000	Subsidising coach transport to BSC for swimming sessions and coach transport to PE events/festivals	1, 2, 4 and 5	To enable safe transport for classes and staff to and from swimming lessons and sporting events/festivals.	Enabled safe, consistent transport for all students and staff to enable swimming lessons for all children in Years 4, 5 and 6 throughout the academic year as well as a range of children to sporting events/festivals throughout the year.
£1,500	OAA (water sports and orienteering) 4-hour session at Wansbeck Riverside led by LASP with RPS staff supporting x4.	1, 2, 3 and 4	To enable all children in KS2, irrespective of engagement with residential trips featuring Outdoor Adventurous Activities, to take part in OAA meeting the requirements of the National Curriculum. All children in KS2 will have the opportunity to work in small, half-class groups to participate in water sports and orienteering sessions led by LASP staff. In total, 14 RPS staff will be involved with supporting provision of events and gain experience in leading/managing OAA tasks.	Allowed for all KS2 children to take part in two OAA activities in order to comply with National Curriculum requirements. In addition, a range of RPS staff throughout school worked with LASP staff to gain experience in planning and delivering OAA events.

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£975	Teach Active Maths and English Subscription (1 year) Starting September 2023	1, 2, 3 and 4	To be used as an additional resource, in line with existing core resources, in the teaching of English and mathematics. Teach Active supplies lesson plans and resources, appropriate for both whole-class, group and individual interventions as well as potential homework ideas. Following trial period, the resources will be used within planning across school to complement existing provision and contribute towards increased levels of physical activity in the school day.	To be reviewed in Summer 2024.
