Welcome to the latest newsletter from Bowmer + Kirkland regarding the re-development of Ringway Primary School.

Project Information

Over the past few months significant progress has been made internally and the new building is now nearing completion ready for handover to the school in April.

In the coming weeks you will see the external landscaping progress. As the site compound is removed to enable works to the playing field to take place, you may notice an increase in construction related traffic but we will do all we can to keep disruption to a minimum.

From May we will start demolition of the existing school, construction of the carpark and forming of play areas until completion in October. The approved phasing plans originally included site access from Beverley Drive but having re-evaluated the impact this would have on the local community, we will be maintaining the site access at the intersection of Beverley Drive and Ringway.

We thank you for your patience and cooperation during the project and we will keep you up to date with activities on site in following newsletters.

Care for the Environment

Constructors must minimise their impact and enhance the natural environment, by:

- Prioritising environmental issues to protect the natural environment and minimising negative impacts.
- Optimising the use of resources, including minimising carbon throughout the value chain.
- Engaging with the community to improve the local environment in a meaningful way.

Value their Workforce

Constructors must create a supportive, inclusive, and healthy workplace, by:

- Actively encouraging and supporting an inclusive and diverse workplace.
- Proactively supporting safe working, mental and physical wellbeing at work.
- Providing workplaces that are, well maintained, clean and secure from physical and biological hazards.
