Please Label ALL School Uniform

Please remember to label all parts of your child's uniform. This makes it a lot easier and quicker to find any lost items.

Lateness

School starts for all children at 8.45am, classroom doors close at 8.50am with registers closing at 8.50am.

Last half term, there was an increased number of children arriving very late for school - if a child is late more than 30 minutes this is marked as an absence and effects the child's attendance record. If the child becomes a persistent absentee, even through lateness, this will trigger EWO (Education Welfare Officer) involvement.

Reminder, If your child is absent, as per school policy, you must inform the school office either by telephone, voicemail or via email by 9.30am on each day of absence.

Appointments During the School Day.

Where possible, all appointments should be made outside of school hours. Where this is not possible, please make the appointment as late as possible in the school day. Children should not be leaving school to attend appointments for other family members - proof of any appointments must be presented to the school office when requesting leave for any appointment (this includes any family member). Failure to do so will result in an unauthorised absence.

PF Uniform

Class PE days may have changed this half-term, please ensure you keep up to date via Class Dojo. Children should come to school on their PE day in PE uniform. As per our <u>School Uniform Policy</u>, this must be a **plain** white t-shirt, black shorts, leggings or jogging bottoms and plain black trainers. Children can also wear a black hoody (optional) or their school jumper/cardigan.

Update from the School Rebuilding Division, Department for Education

We recognise that the delays to progressing the new school building for Ringway Primary School is frustrating for all parties involved. We are currently working through some technicalities with the contractor. However, we hope to submit a planning application early in the new year and get into contract before the summer to start work on site soon after. We would like to reassure you that the department remains committed to providing Ringway Primary School with a new school building and we will continue to work with our partners to achieve this.

Parking - Local Residents and Yellow Lines

Please continue to be mindful of our local residents when parking outside school and **remember the yellow lines should not be parked on at any times**. Despite numerous communications and reminders from school, it is disappointing that these issues are still ongoing. We need to rely on parents/carers to help keep all our children safe outside of our school.

Last term, there were posts being uploaded and shared onto social media sites by members of the public of the cars stopping on the yellow lines.



Times Table Rock Stars is an amazing online tool to help children learn and practise their times tables. In Key Stage 2, by the end of Year 4, all children are expected to confidently know all of their tables and sit a Multiplication Tables Check.

All children in school from Year 2 upwards have an individual account and teachers can track how often children are logging on to their accounts. Children in Key stage 2 should be logging in and spending some time on this each week as part of their weekly homework tasks but it is very disappointing to see that very few children are practising regularly when this is such an important skill for children to have. Knowing their multiplications supports all other areas of the maths curriculum resulting in increased confidence in learning.

Please encourage your child to access and practise these regularly (even as little as 5 minutes a day), it really does make a difference.

Free School Meals and Pupil Premium.

Pupil Premium is more than just free school meals. The Pupil Premium entitles your child to free school meals (worth over £400 a year) and in addition provides school with crucial funding (up to an additional £1,320 per eligible student). It is essential that, if your child is eligible for the Pupil Premium, you apply for free school meals (even if they are an infant who already receives free school meals or if you have no intention of taking up free school meals). This ensures that both your child and others in school are able to benefit from the additional funding the Pupil Premium generates.

Families who qualify for free school meals are also supported with vouchers for food/clothing throughout each school holiday period.
