The Main Character – An imaginative young girl looking for a story that perfectly represents who she is.

<u>Plot</u> – a young girl opens a storybook hoping to find a tale perfect for her and tumbles inside. As she travels through classic fairy tales—including <i>Goldilocks</i> , <i>Jack and the Beanstalk</i> , and <i>Little Red Riding Hood</i> —she realizes none of them are her story. Empowered, she decides to write her own, taking her place as the hero.	
<u>Themes</u> – self belief, identity, creativity, empowerment, representation.	
<u>Setting</u> – The main character tumbles through a variety of classic, well-known fairytale settings.
