Important SATs Dates

Year 2 will be completing their optional SATs in small groups throughout the month of May. These are marked by our school staff and are used to help inform the teacher's end of Key Stage One assessment.

Year 4 will be undertaking the Multiplication Tables Check from Monday 3rd June - Friday 14th June.

Year 6 SATs take place from Monday 13th May - Thursday 16th May. These are externally marked and school will receive their results in early July. Results will be shared with parents within the children's annual reports.

Good attendance is extremely important throughout these time periods.

Parent's Evenings

Parent's evenings are scheduled for the week beginning 4th March. You will receive your child's spring report by Friday 1st March and parent's evening is an opportunity to discuss progress so far, next steps and targets. Please ensure you sign up to a suitable time using the online link which will be sent via ParentPay later this week.

Parking - Local Residents and Yellow Lines

Please continue to be mindful of our local residents when parking outside school and **remember the yellow lines should not be parked on at any times**. Despite numerous communications and reminders from school, it is disappointing that these issues are still ongoing. We need to rely on parents/carers to help keep all our children safe outside of our school.

Times Tables Rock Stars



Times Table Rock Stars is an amazing online tool to help children learn and practise their times tables. In Key Stage 2, by the end of Year 4, all children are expected to confidently know all of their tables and sit a Multiplication Tables Check.

Children from Year 2 upwards have an individual account and teachers can track how often children are logging on to their accounts. Children in Key stage 2 should be logging in and spending some time on this each week as part of their weekly homework tasks but it is very disappointing to see that very few children are practising regularly when this is such an important skill for children to have. Knowing their multiplications supports all other areas of the maths curriculum resulting in increased confidence in learning.

Please encourage your child to access and practise these regularly (even as little as 5 minutes a day), it really does make a difference.

Attendance


Good attendance is 97% or more. If we have concerns about your child's attendance, we will contact you so that we can offer support and work together to make sure your child's attendance is good. We work closely with an Education Welfare Officer (EWO) who will also work with families if there is concern about school attendance and punctuality.

What you can do to help your child?

- Ensure your child arrives at school on time—not late.
- Establish a good routine in the morning and evenings so your child is prepared for the school day ahead.
- Try to arrange dental and medical appointments outside school hours.
- Always inform the school if your child is absent due to illness.
- Take family holidays outside term time.
- Talk to your child about school and take an interest in their school and homework.
- Attend all parents evenings and school events where possible.
- Praise and reward your child's achievements at school. Always support school staff in their efforts to control difficult or challenging behaviour.
- Discuss any problems or difficulties with the school—staff are here to help and will always be supportive.


