### Communication, Language and Literacy

Core Book- Room On The Broom

The story will be retold to the children by a witch. Following a story map and puppets, the children will become familiar with the key events and repeated refrains. The children will be introduced to Makaton signs for the main characters to support communication. In small groups, children will further explore the story by using the Tales Toolkit to discuss the characters, setting, problem and solution. The children will have access to a story basket filled with puppets and props to retell the story or recreate a story of their own.

Phonics focus: Identifying rhyming words in the story, small group "silly soup" rhyming activity.

#### Physical Development

Develop their pencil grip and control to draw a dragon in our quided drawing sessions.

Strengthen our finger muscles by manipulating dough and pipe cleaners to make spiders.

Use pipettes to strengthen our finger muscles to make potions.
