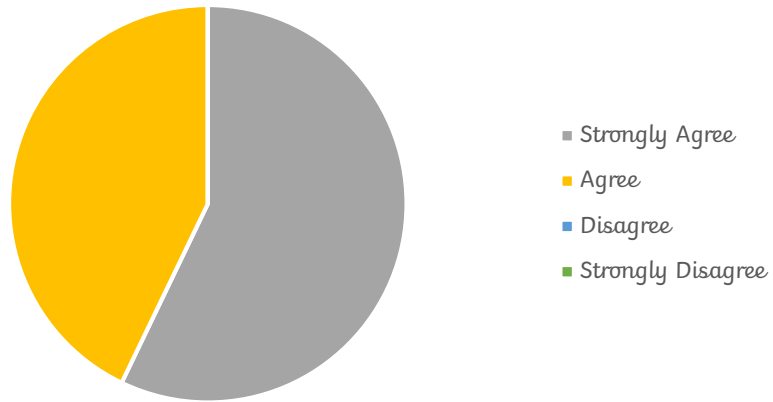
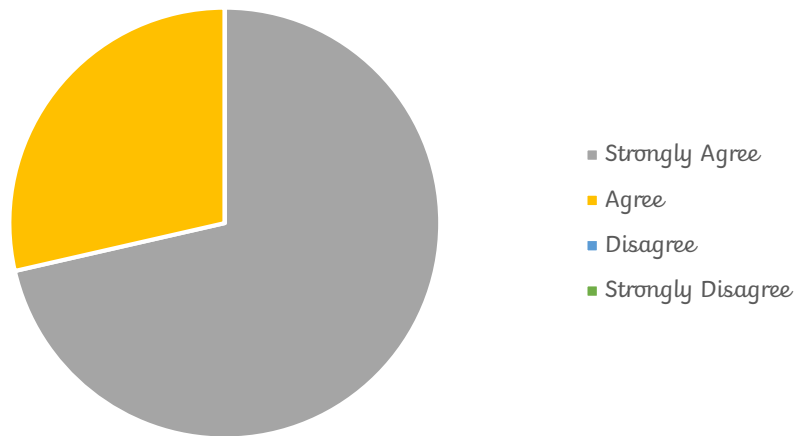

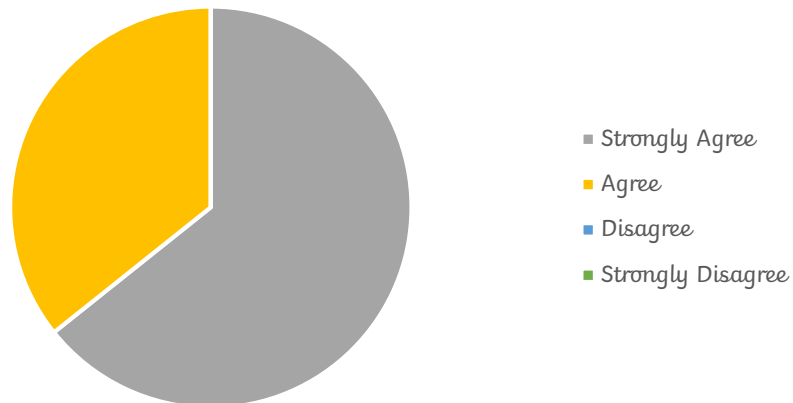
I enjoy PSHE education.



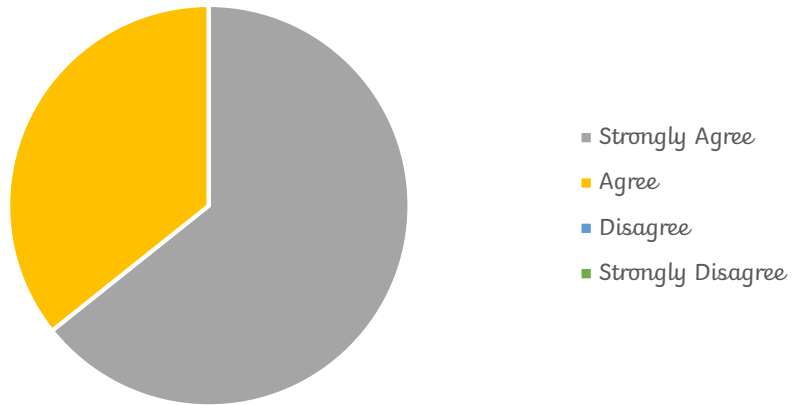
I learn a lot in PSHE.



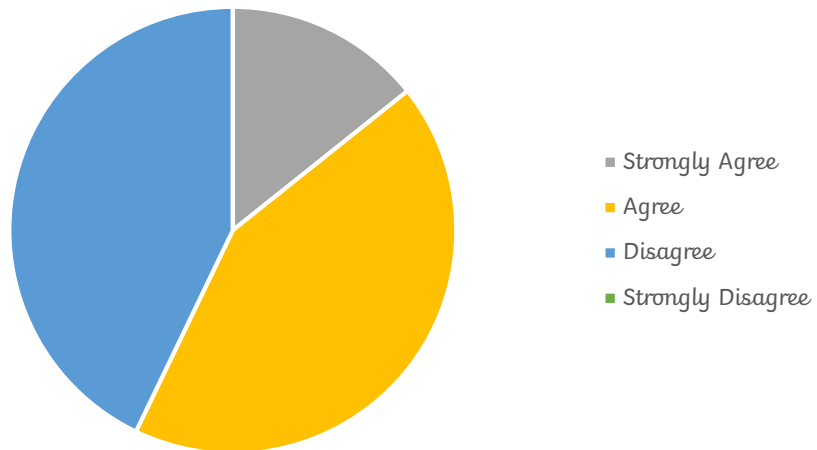
What we do in PSHE is correctly aimed at people of my age.



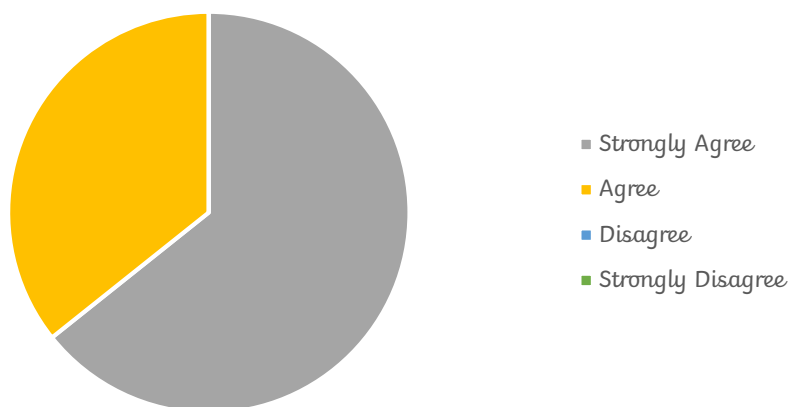
I think PSHE is an important part of the school curriculum.



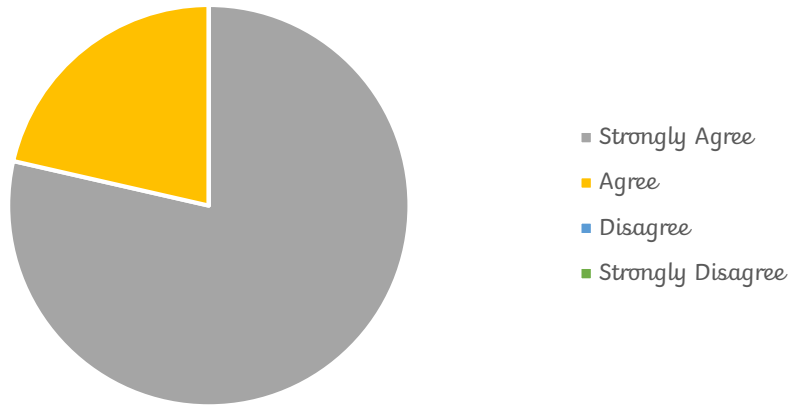
Enough time each week is given to PSHE.



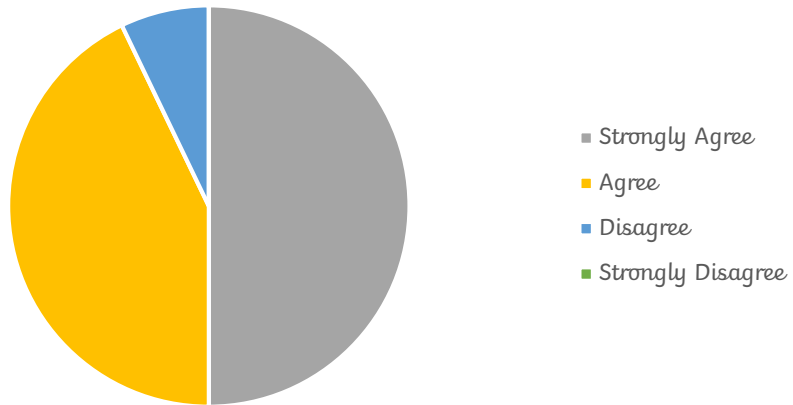
My teacher thinks PSHE is an important part of the school curriculum.



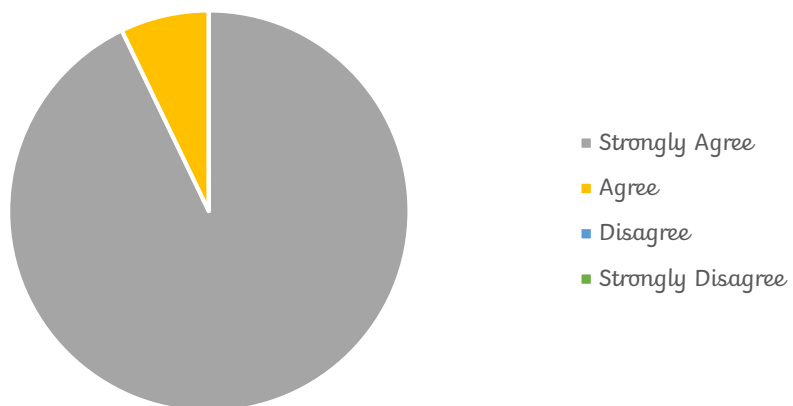

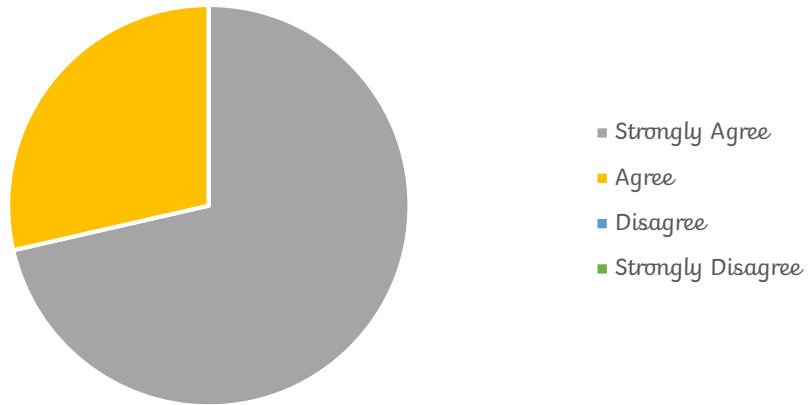

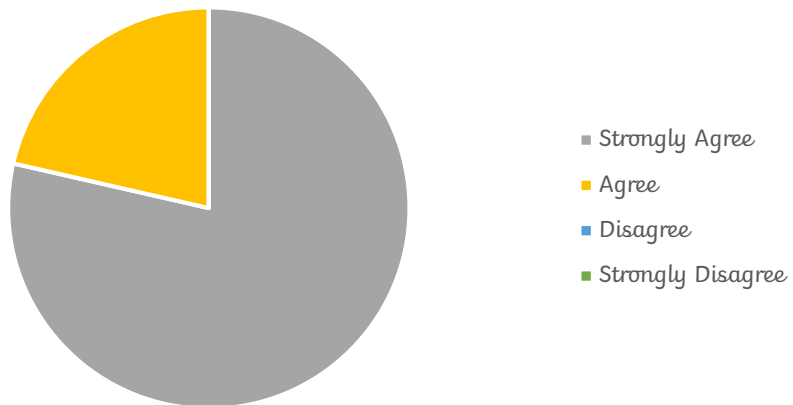

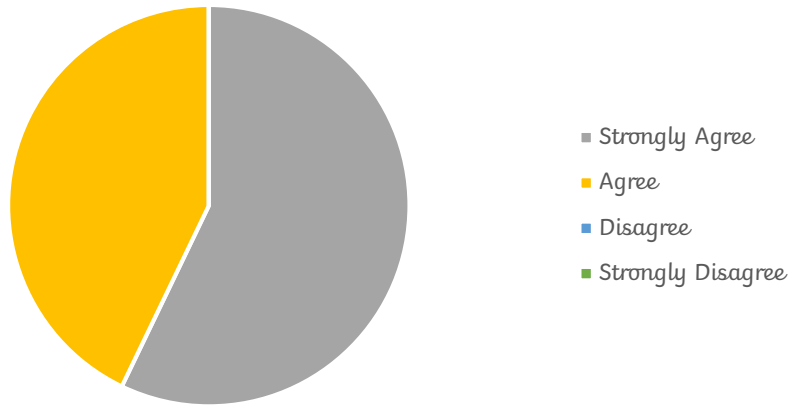

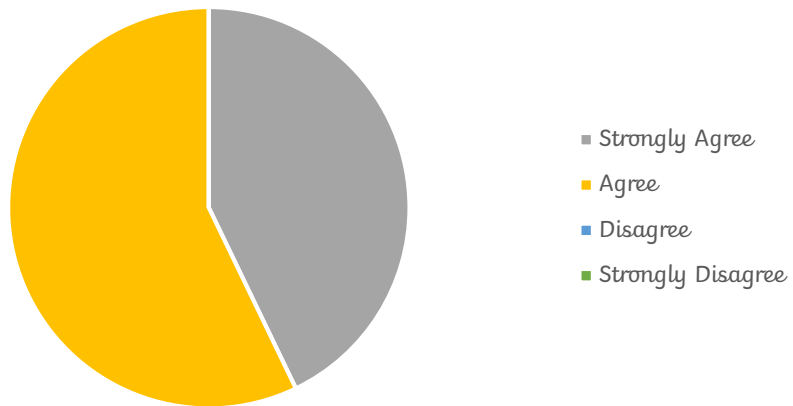
A wide range of different activities are used in PSHE.



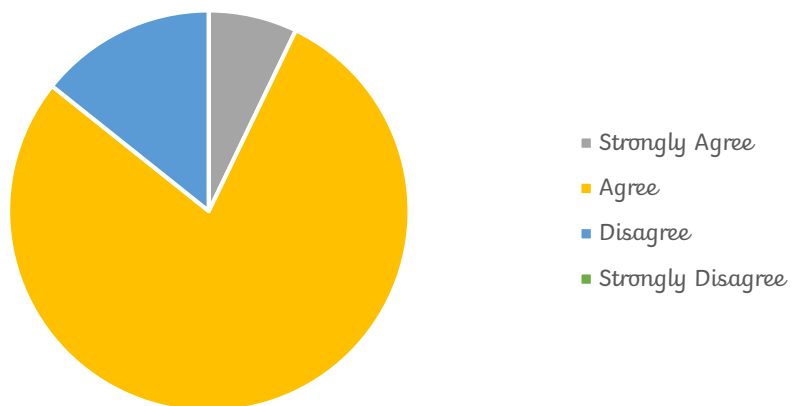
In PSHE there is an emphasis on learning skills for life.

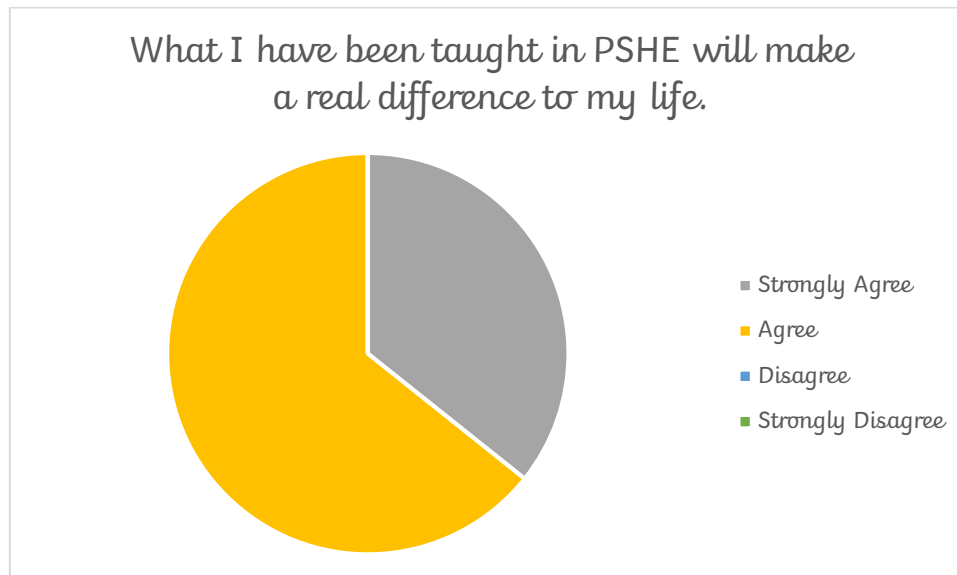


There are opportunities in my school life to use skills taught in PSHE.
