Key Vocabulary

Jolt	To jar, shake, or cause to move by or as if by a sudden rough thrust; shake up roughly.
Ardent	Intensely devoted, eager, or enthusiastic.
Writhing	Twisting about or squirming, as from pain or violent effort.
Fatigue	Weariness from bodily or mental exertion.
Pursue	To strive to gain; seek to attain or accomplish.
Eagerly	In a way that shows keen interest or fervent, often impatient desire or feeling.
Trudge	To walk, especially laboriously or wearily.
Smothering	Stifling or suffocating, as by smoke or other means of preventing free breathing.
