Biomes

What are biomes?

The simplest way to describe **biomes** is:
'Biomes are areas of the world that share a similar climate but because of that climate they are the natural home of similar plants and animals.'

Which biomes are found in Europe?

The biomes found in Europe are: deciduous forest, boreal forest, tundra, chaparral and grassland. The **biomes** not found in Europe are: desert, tropical rainforest and savannah. The main reasons for those **biomes** being the ones found in Europe are that all of Europe is quite far from the equator and the tropics (where it is hottest) and that a lot of Europe is close to the Arctic circle (where is it coldest).
