Year 6 – Celebrating Difference

Overview

The class will talk about differences and similarities and that for some people, being different is hard. The children talk about bullying and how people can have power over others in a group. They talk strategies for dealing with this as well as wider bullying issues. The class talk about people with disabilities and look at specific examples of disabled people who have amazing lives and achievements.

Knowledge

- Know that there are different perceptions of 'being normal' and where these might come from.
- Know that being different could affect someone's life.
- Know that power can play a part in a bullying or conflict situation.
- Know that people can hold power over others individually or in a group.
- Know why some people choose to bully others.
- Know that people with disabilities can lead amazing lives.
- Know that difference can be a source of celebration as well as conflict.
