## Key Vocabulary

Map	Pictorial representation of land as seen from above.
Aerial photo	A picture taken from directly overhead.
Grid reference	System for locating features on a map.
Longitude	Imaginary vertical lines used for grid reference.
Latitude	Imaginary horizontal lines used for grid reference.
Settlement	A place where people live, for example, a village, town or city.
Data	Information.
Agriculture	Farming, both crops and livestock.
Forest	Areas of trees, either natural or deliberately planted.
Trader	Someone who buys and sells things to make money.

## Topic Overview

- To become more proficient in the understanding and use of maps, particularly those published by Ordnance Survey, using four-figure grid reference, symbols and keys to find and identify desired information.
- To investigate land use in Northumberland, representing it statistically in a variety of ways enabling easy comparison.
- To identify possible origins of Northumbrian settlements.
